Registration, Fees Payment, and Refund Policy: Applications are accepted for complete sessions only. To build our camp community, campers may not come and go during a session.

Campers may register by submitting an application with payment. Applications may be submitted online (see directions on website) or by mailing an application to Camp Windhover. Fees may be paid online (see directions on website) or by mailing a check to Camp Windhover. If applying before June 1, a deposit of \$300 must be made at time of registration, and the balance of the fee must be paid no later than June 1. The \$300 deposit will be credited toward camp fees. If applying after June 1, the entire fee must be paid at time of registration. The \$300 deposit is refundable if cancellation is received by March 1, nonrefundable thereafter. The balance of the fee is refundable as follows: 100% refundable if cancellation is received by May 1, 75% refundable if cancellation is received between May 1 and May 31, and nonrefundable after May 31, except for documented physical illness (not including homesickness), in which case fees (except deposit) are 50% refundable. Of course, if you register for a session that is full and you are unable to attend a different session, your fees will be returned in full. CIT payments are due by June 1 and are refundable for documented illness only.

Health Form: Please submit a completed health form including doctor's signature at least one week before your camp session. If your child has had a recent check-up, many pediatricians will sign the form without requiring another doctor visit. You do not need to submit the health form at the time of registration. Forms are available online or call us. Should it be necessary for your child to be seen by a doctor for illness or an injury while at camp, we will notify you

Visitation: Camp affords children and young adults a rare chance to develop the self-reliance, self-confidence, and independence necessary to grow to their fullest potential. To help your child take full advantage of this opportunity, parents and relatives should not interrupt the camp program. Parents are welcome to visit camp on opening and closing days of camp sessions and are encouraged to view the facility and meet with staff at those times.

Packages: To tie the threads of our camp community into a lasting bond, we discourage the often-competitive practice of care packages from home. We ask parents to inform relatives and friends that care packages will not be distributed.

Telephone: Cell phones are not permitted. Campers may use the camp telephone to return emergency calls to immediate family.

Online photo gallery and e-mail: In order to share camp experiences with parents, we post a photo gallery during each camp session. Also, we encourage children to write letters home. You may e-mail your camper through "e-mail your camper" on our website. We will print and distribute e-mails once each day at canteen mid-afternoon.

Other Camp Policies: We reserve the right to refuse acceptance of any applicant who in our judgment will neither benefit from nor contribute to the camp experience. The camp director also reserves the right to dismiss from camp a camper or CIT whose behavior is detrimental to the best interest of the camp.

THE USE OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, OR NON-PRESCRIPTION DRUGS IS NOT PERMITTED AND WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE DISMISSAL. If your camper requires prescription drugs, please bring them to camp in the prescription bottle from the pharmacy and leave them with the camp director at check-in.

Bills for accidents and illnesses requiring outside medical attention will be forwarded to you for submission to your insurance company. In event of an emergency or the illness or injury of your child, the camp director will contact you.

Appropriate Camp Attire: While we do not have a dress code, everyone is expected to wear appropriate non-suggestive camp attire. For girls, camp-appropriate two-piece bathing suits are permitted (not "string bikinis").

Directions to Camp Windhover: The camp is near Crystal Springs, Mississippi, about 30 miles south of Jackson. From I-55, take the North Crystal Springs exit onto Highway 27. Proceed east on Hwy 27 for 3.4 miles. Take a right onto Blocker Road, which will dead-end into Six Mile Road. Turn left onto Six Mile Road and drive 3/10 mile to Camp Windhover, which is on the right.

Arrival and Departure: For summer camp, arrive between 2:30 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. Counselors will not be available to supervise campers until 2:30. Closing activities begin at 10:00 a.m. in the theater at each session's close, followed by the campers' departure. Please notify the camp director if someone other than the camper's parents will be picking up your camper from camp. Do not bring your pets to camp to unload and load campers, please.

Airline Arrival and Departure: For an additional fee of \$50 each way, camp staff will pick up and return your camper to the airport in Jackson (JAN). Please contact us to arrange.

We accept applications in the order in which we receive them. Should we receive your application after we have reached our limit per session, we will notify you that your name has been placed on our waiting list.
